Exploring Oil with Cold Wax Supply List Candace French Mixed Media Artist

- 1 4 oz. jar of cold wax medium, either Gamblin or Dorland's found at Guirys or Micheals.
- 1 Selection of at least 3 small tubes of oil paints in your favorite brand and colors. Note: the water based oil paints dry faster and are easier to use.
- 2 Wood Panels or Canvas Boards, 6" X 6", 10" X 10" or 8" X 10". The key is to have a firm surface.
- Palette knife with rounded tip about 3" in length for the flat part and a bend in the handle and a rounded tip about the size of the end of one of your small fingers. The palette knife looks like a pie server because it has a bend in the handle, but, it is smaller. It can be metal or plastic.
- Palette, or flat surface for blending paints. There is a broad range of palettes. You
 can choose a pad of disposable palette sheets, a large glass palette or a plastic
 palette container with or without a lid, styrofoam plate or tin foil.
- Optional household tools such as basting brushes, plastic combs, anything for scraping and mark making. Dollar Store or Dollar Tree have a great selection.
- Brushes: One or two brushes small round brushes.
- Roll of 1" painters or masking tape.
- Small container of odorless mineral spirits.
- Note pad and pen or pencil for taking notes.
- \$3.00 supply fee to instructor.
